How does your prescription drug plan work?



Stage		Who pays?	How long does this stage last?
1	Annual Deductible	Member Pays: Our plan does not have an annual deductible.	Until you spend up to the dollar amount set by your plan.
2	Initial Coverage	Member Pays: Copays for each covered prescription drug. Plan Pays: The rest of the costs for each covered prescription drug.	Until your total drug costs for the year reach \$2,970.
3	Coverage Gap	Member Pays: •Our plan covers all formulary drugs in the coverage gap Plan Pays: The rest of the costs for drugs covered by your plan during the gap. Some of these costs are also paid by drug manufacturer discounts.	Until your True Out-of- Pocket costs for the year reach \$4,750.
4	Catastrophic Coverage	Member Pays: A small copay. \$2.65 generic / \$6.60 all other drugs Plan Pays: The rest of the costs for drugs covered by your plan during the Catastrophic Coverage Stage.	Until your plan's 2014 renewal date. You then return to Stage 1.

Part B vs. Part D Drugs

- This plan covers Medicare Part D prescription drugs only
- Original Medicare Part B provides benefits for certain chemotherapy drugs, certain drug injections you are given during an ov, and drugs you are given at a dialysis facility
- This plan covers all of your Part D diabetic drugs/supplies. This includes insulin, needles/syringes, alcohol swabs, gauze pads
- Original Medicare Part B will cover your diabetic supplies including monitors, test strips, lancets, etc.
- Part D Vaccines are included in your plan. They include influenza,
 Pneumococcal Pneumonia, Hepatitis B and Shingles
 - Where you get the vaccine and who administers it will determine your cost

GOOD NEWS!!

- Your plan is providing you a bonus drug list. This list gives you additional coverage on some prescriptions drugs that are normally excluded from coverage on the formulary.
- The drugs listed on the bonus drug list are in addition to your Part D drug coverage.
- The copays that you pay for these additional drugs do not go toward your
 Medicare Part D out of pocket costs.
